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Who here would probably...

Time:	15-20 minutes
Function:	a fun activity to do near the end of a course after the students have gotten to know
	each other
Arrangement:	4+ in a group

Instructions:

- 1. Give one worksheet to each group.
- 2. After completing the activity, check whose name appears on the worksheet the most. (It can be fun to reveal to the entire class what assumptions were made and to ask which ones truly reflect his/her personality.)



What do your classmates think about you? Student-A reads one of the questions from the worksheet. When everyone understands the question, student-A counts: 1... 2... 3... at which point everyone must quickly vote by pointing at one of the students in the group. The student with the most votes writes his or her name under that question. Now student-B reads a question... and so on.

For example:

A: Who here spends the most time looking in a mirror? Ready? 1...2...3...VOTE!

<3 people point at C, 2 people point at A, 1 person points at D> <Student C writes her name under that question.>



Variation:

Have students vote by writing on a piece of paper, then revealing the name on the count of 3. After each vote, write the winner's name on the worksheet and give one point to all of the students who voted with the majority. The winner is the person who voted with the majority the most often.
